



Result Analysis of students Divisionwise







SWOT Analysis for the Department of Economics

Strengths:

- **3.** Infrastructure: The department has adequate facilities including classrooms, library resources, and possibly specialized economics labs.
- 4. Curriculum: The curriculum is likely well-designed and regularly updated to meet industry and academic standards.
- 5. Student Body: The department may attract dedicated and motivated students who are passionate about economics.Weaknesses:
- 1. Resource Constraints: Limited funding and resources might hinder the department's ability to expand or upgrade facilities.
- 2. Limited Research Output: There might be a lack of significant research output or publications from the faculty and students.
- 3. Technology Integration: There could be a need to improve integration of technology in teaching methods and research.
- 4. Industry Connections: Opportunities for students to engage with industry professionals or internships may be limited.
- 5. Poverty: majority of the students are coming from poor economic background and working part-time to maintain expenditure.

Opportunities:

- **1.** Collaboration: Opportunities to collaborate with local industries, NGOs, or government bodies for research projects even though is limited to UG students.
- 2. Student Development: Potential to introduce more workshops, seminars, or guest lectures to enhance student skills and knowledge.
- 3. Research Funding: Pursue external funding opportunities for research projects, which could enhance departmental resources.
- 4. Networking: Strengthen alumni relations and networking opportunities for students to facilitate career placements.
- 5. New Programs: Introducing new interdisciplinary programs or specializations within economics to attract a broader range of students.

Threats:

- 1. Market Competition: Increasing competition from other colleges and universities offering economics programs.
- 2. Changing Regulations: Changes in government policies or regulations affecting funding or curriculum requirements.
- 3. Economic Factors: Economic downturns affecting student enrollments or funding availability.
- 4. Technological Changes: Rapid changes in technology impacting traditional teaching methods and student expectations.
- 5. Last choice: the students are making economics as a last choice subject , hence unable to attract good students.
