1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 INTRODUCTION

Laxminarayan College, named after Pandit Laxminarayan Mishra, the famous freedom fighter of Odisha, is one of the premier Higher Education Institutions in the district of Jharsuguda, Odisha. The College is an UG College, established on tdt18.08.1969. Affiliated to Sambalpur University, it has the status of being a nongovernment Grant-in-aid college, and has both 2(f) and 12(B) recognitions from the UGC. The College has been catering to the needs of all the stakeholders since the last 55 years and was accredited by NAAC. The College has received the RUSA grant for academic and infrastructural development. It has also received grants from the World Bank under OHEPEE of the Department of Higher Education, Government of Odisha. The College is currently offering 11 courses in B.A., B.Sc. and B.Com. It has got the permission to start PG in Odia, Hindi, English, Mathematics and Commerce from the session 2024-25. The College has well ventilated classrooms. Some of the classrooms are ICT-enabled. There are well-equipped laboratories, Seminar Rooms, Conference Hall, Language Lab, Library and Reading room. The college also has separate rooms for IQAC, common rooms for boys and girls, one gymnasium, canteen, NCC/NSS/YRC Rooms, one yoga room, room for Innovation & Research Development Cell and separate toilets for boys and girls for staff as well as students. The office operates through separate sections, namely the Accounts Section, Cash section, SAMS section and Examination Cell. The College has a botanical garden in the middle of it. It has one Girls' hostels and one Boys' hostel. Three more hostels (including two SC/ST hostel for boys and girls) are under construction funded by WODC and ITDA Department, Govt. of Odisha. The College has NSS, NCC (Army/Naval/Air wings), YRC, Red Ribbon Club, Electoral Literacy Club and a host of other associations.

With the motto "Together we make the difference," Laxminarayan College, Jharsuguda aims at changing the life of the boys and girls of Jharsuguda. The dedication, commitment and loyalty of the faculty and other staff, along with the enthusiasm and achievements of the students over the years have contributed largely to bring our college to its present position.

Percentage of full time teachers with sanctioned posts is 82% at present.

Research, Innovations and Extension

Resource Mobilization for Research:

College provides all facility to faculty members for quality research. This includes organizing national & state level seminars/conferences, participation in conferences, granting TA/DA, registration fees and duty leave etc. UGC has granted minor & major research projects to the teachers of the college.

Innovation Ecosystem:

College has a botanical garden which creates small ecosystem for local flora & fauna. College also invites experts from local Industries and organizes Industry tours for students. Our College has been the nodal college in organizing hackathon in the district level where young students had showcased their innovations. Students, with their innovative ideas, participated in the competitions and received prizes during Odisha Start up yatra. The College, in collaboration with the EDI, Odisha and DIC, Jharsuguda, conducted entrepreneurship trainings for the students.

Research Publications & Awards:

While conducting research, college motivates the faculty to rely on genuine work and not to indulge in plagiarism and any other unethical practices. Faculty members of the college have published quality research papers in journals of national and international level. Faculty member has authored, edited books and also contributed towards conference proceedings during last five years. The College has brought out an Edited Book called "Exploration of Feminine Identity through Research and Innovation in India: Focus on Odisha" is a unique venture of its own kind.

Extension Activities:

NSS, NCC (Army/Navy/Air wing), YRC and other Cells of the college have sensitized the community towards important social issues through a number of extension activities. Our college has actively promoted social values and responsibilities among faculty members and students through various extension activities aimed at the development of the society. Our NCC cadets, NSS and YRC volunteers, under the guidance of the faculty members, have contributed to the community during the COVID-19 pandemic. Faculty members and college itself has been recognized appropriately and received awards from Govt. /govt. recognized bodies during last five years.

Collaborations:

College has entered into MOUs and collaborations with NGOs, social and educational institutes both local and national level. Different cultural, intellectual activities, field study, survey work have been organized under these MOUs and collaborations.

Infrastructure and Learning Resources

Physical Facilities:

During the last five years the college has added a few infrastructure like a new academic block from RUSA grant, one 50 seated SC/ST Boys' hostel from World Bank assisted funds, new library and reading room from 5T funding of the Government of Odisha, a canteen from WODC funds, Golden jubilee gate constructed by the Vedanta Ltd from its CSR fund and boundary walls from the college fund. At present three hostels are under construction.

College has adequate facilities for teaching-learning viz. classrooms, laboratories, computers etc. Though facilities are available for sports but not sufficient. Facilities for cultural activities include drama pendal, conference hall, seminar hall, etc.

Library:

Kavi Binod Chandra Nayak Granthalay is an automated library which has a collection of knowledge resources such as biographies, competitive exam books, general reading books, dictionaries, encyclopedia, etc. College allots budget for library. All Students & teachers have access to library. Library is stacked with necessary books pertaining to the syllabus and reference materials. The students are permitted to borrow books from library. Apart from the main library, every department has its own department library with a considerable number of books to enhance the reading habits of the students and thereby enrich their knowledge. There is separate seating arrangement for boys, girls and teachers with free internet facility in the reading room.

IT/ICT Infrastructure:

The IT Lab has 39 computers which accommodates both students and faculty. It also facilitates online valuation works. There is an advanced Communication cum Language lab in the College where students get soft skills and communication skills training. The Conference Hall is an advanced Hall with an Interactive touch Panel where Seminars, Conferences, Workshops have been organised. Ten projectors are installed at the essential classrooms. The institute has a sufficient number of computers with high speed internet connectivity which are accessed by the teachers and students for teaching and learning. Science laboratories are equipped with necessary resources. Each department is provided with a desktop for official as well as academic purpose.

At the beginning of the session, assessment for replacement/upgradation/addition of existing IT infrastructure

is carried out.

Student Support and Progression

Student support:

Students of different categories get benefited by scholarships from Government and other agencies every year. The College provides guidelines for competitive examinations, career counseling, soft skill development and remedial coaching. Some students have qualified in state/national level examinations including JAM, CPET, CUET, GMAT, CAT, State government examinations and central govt. examinations.

Grievance Redressal:

Grievance Redressal mechanism followed by the college is as per the UGC guidelines. Students have been informed about it in the induction classes and through whatsapp groups and institutional website. The institution adopts strict measures for redressal of student grievances including sexual harassment and ragging cases and displays billboards in the campus for awareness.

Student Progression:

Career Guidance and Placement Cell of the college organizes a number of seminars and personality development programmes for the students. Passed out students find placement in the reputed companies, banks and local industry. As most of the students are from business community and agricultural background, they are self-employed. The Entrepreneurship Development Cell organizes such skill development trainings for capacity development.

Students Participation and Activities:

The college provides ample opportunity to the students in decision making and include them in different committees. Every year college organizes a number of sports and cultural events in which students participate. Students are also sponsored for district, state and national level competitions. Students of the college have earned awards & medals at University, State and National level sports & cultural events.

Alumni Engagement:

Registered Alumni Association of the College is engaged in the development of the institution through financial and other support services. They are engaged in career counselling and social outreach programmes. Their contributions are highly appreciated. All the departments have created their Alumni whatsapp groups, by which they connect and involve the alumni members in the department as well as college activities.

Governance, Leadership and Management

Institutional Vision and Leadership:

In line with the vision and mission, the Management of the College works with the Principal, teaching and nonteaching staff for the benefit of the students. College promotes a culture of participative management and

Principal delegates the power to the staff in different committees.

Strategy Development and Deployment:

The organizational structure of college includes college governing body that includes members of management, representative of teachers, non-teaching staff, nominee of the govt., nominee of affiliating university and Principal as ex-office secretary. There are well established rules and procedure for recruitment and promotion which college strictly follows.

Faculty Empowerment Strategies:

College provides a number of welfare measures for its teaching and non-teaching staff including financial support to the teachers participating in conferences/workshop elsewhere. The College organises professional development programmes for both teaching and non-teaching staff. Our teachers are the brand ambassadors of the college. The hold different offices in the district and state level non-profit organisations. Their contribution to the society is acknowledged by the institution. College has Performance Appraisal System for its staff.

Financial Management of Resource Mobilization:

College mobilises funds through well-established procedure approved by statutory bodies and conducts external and internal financial audit regularly.

Internal Quality Assurance System:

IQAC of the college is well functional and coordinates with teaching & non-teaching staff and students and reviews the teaching learning process and learning outcomes. IQAC also undertakes a number of quality initiatives for the promotion of quality culture in the college. IQAC prepares AQAR & submits it to NAAC regularly.

Institutional Values and Best Practices

Institutional Values and Responsibilities:

The Women Development and Gender Sensitisation Cell organizes a number of gender equity programmes from time to time. There is equal opportunity for the girls and boys to participate in academic, culture, sports and extra-curricular activities. College is under 24 hour CCTV surveillance. There are separate common rooms and washrooms for boys & girls in the college. The Anti-Ragging Squad, Discipline Committee as well as NCC officers keep watch on the behavior of the students so that no nuisance take place.

Environmental Consciousness and Sustainability:

The Green Initiative Team makes students aware of energy conversation and preservation of plants. The campus is plastics and polythene free zone.

College has replaced the ordinary light with LEDs and also installed solar panels. College follows necessary norms for waste management and has installed rain harvesting system in the hostels and in the college campus. The college has been certified for green audits, environmental audits, and beyond-the-campus environmental

promotion activities.

Inclusion and Situatedness:

College has undertaken a number of initiatives to address locational advantages with local administration and local community.

Human Values & Professional Ethics;

As a responsible institution, college has a handbook of Code of Conduct for students, teachers, Principal and strictly adheres to it. College also celebrates National Festivals with great enthusiasm. institution. In its academic activities, students have to learn multidisciplinary courses such as Environment studies, Gender and Human Rights, Ethics and Values etc. In CBCS system Environmental Science and Disaster Management is an Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course (AECC). The Institution imparts training and knowledge to make the students ready for jobs and life. The English Communication, Logical reasoning and quantitative aptitude related training is given. Career counselling and training from internal and external experts is given from time to time for succeeding in competitive examinations at State and National level. The courses like Communicative English and Logical Resoning in Skill Enhancement Compulsory Course (SECC) are taught with practical ambiance. The courses being interdisciplinary/multidisciplinary in nature allows collaborative and experiential learning for students to enrich themselves. The curriculum stimulates inquisitiveness, and critical thinking capacity and thus, focusses on the overall development of the learners. The college ensures a multidisciplinary approach in its co-curricular activities also. It regularly organizes workshops, debates, webinars/seminars and training programmes on multidisciplinary themes. The present CBCS system also allows the students to choose subjects from different disciplines as well as projects in interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary mode by formulating teams from different courses. Thus, Laxminarayan College has a legacy of multidisciplinary approach in its academic and cocurricular activities. Laxminarayan College has prepared itself for NEP 2020.

2. Academic bank of credits (ABC):

Being an affiliated college under Sambalpur University, our College follows the rules and regulations framed by the Affiliating University from time to time. As per the letter no.1912/dt.02.05.2024 from the controller of Examination, Sambalpur University, we initiated the formation of Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) Id for the students of recent pass-out batch. The institution has also registered to NAD Digi locker. All students of 2023-24 batch have been asked to register to ABC. The students have already started registering for their ABC ids. The University is in the process of uploading results of students on NAD Digi locker. Institute is constantly

encouraging students of the current enrolled batches to register under ABC and asking them to create ABC id. All the HoDs and faculty members have been asking to encourage students to register so that not a single student is to be left.

3. Skill development:

As per the syllabus prescribed by the affiliating university two skill enhancement compulsory courses (SECC) have been included in the CBCS curriculum. These are 'Communicative English' and 'Quantitative and Logical Thinking'. Students are expected to develop communicative skills which is now a days a very essential skill. And the course 'Quantitative and Logical Thinking' tends to boost the analytical skills of student that can be helpful for them for so many practical purposes. The College has been organizing several activities to promote skills among students. They acquire leadership skills as well as positive attitudes by participating in the activities conducted by NCC, NSS and YRC wings of the college. The Cultural and Dramatic Associations conduct several competitions by which the students enhance their writing, speaking and other creative skills. Students' participation in department seminars, their involvement in regular extra-curricular and extension activities help them to sharp their skills as well as behaviours and thus help in the achievements of vision and mission of the college. It has also been organizing activities for the development of soft skills, language skills, ICT skills, etc. for its students. The Career Counselling and Placement Cell of the College has been organizing various training programmes for the students to develop their entrepreneurial skills. Many successful alumni in the field of law, accountancy, and chartered accountancy engage the students as interns. A few alumni being the successful entrepreneurs guide the students regularly. The student's language skills are vital for their success in their chosen fields. The acquisition of such skills improves employability. It boosts students' confidence. They gain confidence by participating in the Group discussion, One minute speech, Mock interview, etc. which have been the parts of Short Term courses and special coaching classes for state/national level examination offered by the College. So, Laxminarayan College is prepared to implement NEP. The NEP will offer many opportunities for skill development of students. As

4. Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course):

the guidelines say, there will be many Vocational Skill and Skill Enhancement courses (VSEC) which is going to be beneficial for the students.

The choice based credit system allows students to choose the course they want to study. This also provide opportunity to study an Indian language of his/her own choice. The study of this paper is compulsory but the choice of language is optional. It is studied under the paper code Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course (AECC). Recently the affiliating university has included a new paper naming 'Ethics and Values'. This course aims to inculcate good culture among the students. Adhering to the existing educational policies and Government circulars, Laxminarayan College has integrated the Indian Knowledge system in its teaching learning process. It offers courses in Odia, Hindi and English medium. The course contents cover ancient knowledge systems, philosophy, culture, ethical and moral values. Laxminarayan College organizes several activities which promote the Indian Knowledge System. We are ready to promote the Indian Knowledge System using modern technology and tools. The college also has a library with several books, novels and magazines in English, Hindi and Odia literature on religion, art and culture. So, Laxminarayan College has started integrating the Indian Knowledge System and is prepared to implement NEP 2020.

5. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

Laxminarayan College focuses on Outcome based education where both faculty members and students are well aware of the course outcomes and are fully concentrating on achieving the intended outcomes. As per the UGC and NAAC guidelines, the Programme Outcomes, Programme Specific Outcomes and Course outcomes have been uploaded in the college website for the knowledge of teachers and students. The faculty members and students are informed about it in the beginning of the session. The students take up courses with a certain goal of developing skills or gaining knowledge and they try to achieve the goals by the end of the course. The faculty members of the College have developed various teaching learning contents such as PPT files, Videos, PDF notes, etc. which are provided to the students. College has focused on experiential and experimental learnings. Students are taken for field

visits for field survey and practical knowledge. Handson training, workshops, GDs, webinars/seminars, etc. on various topics are organized by the institution from time to time to achieve the intended learning objectives. The second Unit in each paper is earmarked for the blended learning which encourages the students for self-learning. So, College is ready for the implementation of NEP.

6. Distance education/online education:

Currently the affiliating university gives no approval to start any distance education or online education as per choice of the institutions. However the College is a centre of the Private Examination Cell of Sambalpur University. The college is also utilized as a study center of Odisha State Open University (OSOU), where students can pursue various courses of their choices in the distance mode. The courses offered by the Open University include degree courses, diploma courses and also certificate courses. Those students who cannot enroll themselves in the regular courses can avail the opportunity. Our College has successfully imparted all its courses content delivery in online mode during the COVID-19 Pandemic Lockdown and also conducted online examinations successfully by using different platforms such as Zoom, Google Meet, etc. The students are also encouraged to use various OER (Open Educational Resources) as well as to explore different online learning platforms. In March 2020 when corona forced a mass shutdown of the institution's physical facilities, the cyber facilities of various online platforms such as Google meet, zoom, Microsoft Teams, Cisco Webex were used very efficiently by the faculty and students alike. During this time the Government of Odisha engaged the teachers to prepare YouTube course videos which the college shared with the students. The blended learning has been adopted as a best practice by the College. Many faculty members use their expertise and develop excellent video content which supplement their content delivery in the classroom. Many of the times, the faculty members use the online resources to demonstrate and help the students to learn by themselves in an effective manner.

Institutional Initiatives for Electoral Literacy

1. Whether Electoral Literacy Club (ELC) has been set up in the College?

The Electoral Literacy Club of Laxminarayan College, Jharsuguda was constituted on 20.07.2023 vide Letter No 3400 dated 6/7/23 of the Sub-Collector, Jharsuguda and the Notification letter No.1194 dated 17/7/2023 of Laxminarayan College Jharsuguda. The objective of the club is to literate all eligible students who can vote (New Voters/Future Voters) and to make them aware about the importance of enjoying voting rights as a responsible and active citizen.

2. Whether students' co-ordinator and co-ordinating faculty members are appointed by the College and whether the ELCs are functional? Whether the ELCs are representative in character?

Yes, the Students' Co-ordinator and Co-ordinating faculty members are appointed by the college and it is functional form 20.07.2023. The ELC of Laxminarayan College, Jharsuguda comprises of total 33 members, out of which 8 are faculty members and other 25 members are students.

3. What innovative programmes and initiatives undertaken by the ELCs? These may include voluntary contribution by the students in electoral processes-participation in voter registration of students and communities where they come from, assisting district election administration in conduct of poll, voter awareness campaigns, promotion of ethical voting, enhancing participation of the under privileged sections of society especially transgender, commercial sex workers, disabled persons, senior citizens, etc.

Observation of National Voter's Day and Constitution Day. f. Quiz, essay and debate competitions g. Distribution of pamphlets in the community h. Interaction with local leaders i. Seminars and talks on the voting rights of citizen j. Awareness campaigns in the locality k. Involving NSS volunteers, NCC cadets and other members in the smooth conduct of polling l. Developing a culture of electoral participation and maximizing the informed and ethical voting by following the principle 'Every Vote Counts' and 'No Voter to be Left Behind'. m. Motivating the students in general to participate in the ELC activities

4. Any socially relevant projects/initiatives taken by College in electoral related issues especially research projects, surveys, awareness drives, creating content, publications highlighting their contribution to advancing democratic values and participation in electoral processes, etc.

The Electoral Literacy Club, Laxminarayan College, Jharsuguda is dedicated to foster democratic values and participation among the students through a range of innovative programs and initiatives. Awareness Drives: Such drives were organized to introduce the students with the electoral process, covering voter registration and the electoral system to equip students with the knowledge they need to be active citizens.

Such programmes were also organized in the adopted village of NSS creating awareness among the general public regarding the proper use of voters' rights. Guest Lectures: The club invited experts, including election officers, to provide valuable insights and facilitate direct student engagement with key figures in the field. Voter Registration Drive: The club conducted voter registration drives by setting help desks making it easy and convenient for students to register. Group Discussions: The club hosts group discussions among students on political and social issues to encourage critical thinking, diverse perspective exploration, and constructive dialogue. Ethical Voting Promotion: Ethical voting was promoted to instill integrity and responsibility in student voters, ensuring they exercise their franchise ethically. Pledges had been taken on National Voters Day and Constitution Day. Special Camps: Special camps were organised for training of the Electoral process. The process of using VVPET and EVM was demonstrated to the students. Participation of student volunteers in the recent General Election: In the recent general election 2024, 23 NCC students of Laxminarayan College were engaged as volunteers in different polling booths of Jharsuguda.

5. Extent of students above 18 years who are yet to be enrolled as voters in the electoral roll and efforts by ELCs as well as efforts by the College to institutionalize mechanisms to register eligible students as voters.

To enroll both new as well as future voters (Students), campaign on voter's registration and Voter's Helpdesk were organized by the ELC in which student volunteers actively participated during the last General Election 2024. Out of 259 eligible students for voter registration, 209 students got registered.

The attainment of program outcomes and courses are evaluated by the institution for timely and adequate measures. As the teaching learning process have been a continuous process measuring its impact have also been a continuous affair. However at the beginning of every session, the subject teachers convey the Programme Objectives and Course Objectives, along with the syllabus to the students at the introductory part of respective subjects. Even during the time of induction ceremony students are informed briefly about the same. In this regards the respective head of the departments keep a vigilant perspective throughout the semester. The Institute follows the evaluation process of Sambalpur University. In-fact it is the part of common state model syllabus and regulation system. Where in this type of evaluation includes internal assessment, unit tests and semester examinations conducted at the end of the course. The Department of Higher Education Government of Odisha has introduced blended learning, where in this system self-study of student, guided by the course teacher is done. Further project work, practical, dissertation writing is the part of the examination process in various subjects. The result of the students is analysed and outcomes are evaluated. Feedback is taken from all stakeholders regarding the program and course outcomes. A designated examination cell and office of controller of examination at the college level is established. The Examination cell not only monitor various inhouse examination like internal, unit test etc but also prepare the annual report of final university examination. Student attendance is closely monitored. Student participation in the classroom discussion is highly appreciated. These discussion helps the course teacher to determine the effectiveness of Programme Objectives and Course Objectives. Besides this direct methodology of monitoring the Programme Objectives and Course

Objectives various indirect methods are followed. The mentor-mentee system and alumni whataaps groups have been one of the major instrument to evaluate the students' performance in other examination, jobs and social condition of students. By whatsapp group mentor teacher with their respective mentee remain connected for life long, which helps the teacher and the institution to know about the outcome of the programme and courses offered by the college. Participation of students in Extra-curricular activities, extension activities, internship programme, placement from the campus are some of the key determinants for monitoring of attainment of Programme Objectives and Course Objectives. As a composite college, the infrastructural strategy of the college is driven by visualization of future necessities of teachers, administrative staff and particularly students in advance. Rooms are shared among intermediate, degree classes and Post graduate classes. Our institute facilitates the students with 55 classrooms and other 32 rooms which are spacious and fitted with lightings, fans and blackboards to make teaching learning process more conducive for learning. Ten projectors are installed at the essential classrooms for impressive and competent learning. The institute has a sufficient number of computers with high speed internet connectivity which are accessed by the teachers and students for teaching and learning. The laboratory for Physical science and Chemistry are equipped with necessary resources to dispense the practical knowledge of students for rich experience. Library is stacked with necessary books pertaining to the syllabus and reference materials. The students are permitted to borrow books from Apart from the main library, every department has its own department library with a considerable number of books to enhance the reading habits of the students and thereby enrich their knowledge. The IT (Computer) Lab has 39 computers which accommodates both students and faculty. It also facilitates online valuation works. There is an advanced Communication cum Language lab in the College where students get soft skills and communication skills training. The Conference Hall is an advanced Hall with a project (Interactive touch Panel) where Seminars, Conferences, Workshops have been organised. The Botanical Garden not only enhances the beauty of the institution, but also provides specimens to the students of the department of Botany. The College utilizes the grants from different sources for the augmentation of Physical infrastructure and learning resources. The Hall No.103 has an Interactive touch Panel facilities and entire College Campus is under CC TV surveillance.

The college is committed to fostering well-rounded student development beyond academics. The following facilities are available for extracurricular activities:

Anti-ragging Cell, Discipline Committee, Grievance Redressal Cell, Sexual Harassment Prevention Cell, Women's Development and Gender Sensitisation Cell is vigilant in ensuring a safe environment to promote gender sensitization. We collaborate with the NGOs and peripheral industries like SEHADA, Eita Jivan Vi, Vedanta Ltd. etc. for different gender related activities.

Curriculum

The college curriculum is designed to inculcate values. The 'Ethics and Value' paper, taught in each semester, teaches the importance of human values and instills social responsibility among students. BEST PRACTICE I

Title of the Practice: The Community Based Practice for Research Papers

- 1. Objectives of the Practice:
- To inculcate social values and sense of responsibilities towards community among students.
- To promote positive social change by empowering communities.
- To foster ethical research practices among students

3.The Context:

Since Project Paper(DSE-4) had been introduced in the syllabus from 2021-22, the college has adopted the practice of taking students to the threshold of community and encouraging them to write project papers on the topics relating to the issues pertaining to the neighborhood communities.

4.The Practice:

Most of the departments encourage students to choose topics relating to the community. By incorporating this community-based approach, student project papers transform from academic exercises into opportunities for positive social change. Students gain valuable experience while making a real contribution to their local communities. After selecting the topics, the students move to the practical fields, do surveys, take interviews, study their problems, involve people in their projects and ultimately prepare the projects that can be beneficial to the community. Students of humanities, Biological Sciences, Physical Sciences, etc. get involved in people's lives and get opportunities to make it a long-term project to bring a change in the society.

5. Evidence of Success:

This practice is improving the Community-Institution bonding. A sense of belongingness and a concept of "my community my responsibility" is being fostered among students.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required:

While the community-based approach offers a wealth of benefits for student project papers, there are also some challenges to consider

Challenges:

- Time Constraints: Balancing coursework and community involvement can be tricky, especially for shorter projects.
- Logistics and Coordination: Scheduling meetings, coordinating data collection, and managing communication with community partners can be time-consuming.
- Lack of Communication Skills: Due to poor communication skills of a few students, they may not extract information properly
- However guide teachers can play a key role in facilitating communication and logistics between students and community partners. They can provide workshops or training sessions to help students navigate power dynamics and develop collaboration skills. Striking a balance between addressing real community needs and ensuring students gain the teachers can provide valuable learning experiences to them.
- By acknowledging these challenges and implementing solutions, educators and students can navigate the community-based approach effectively. This can lead to richer learning experiences, stronger project outcomes, and a positive impact on the community.

Best Practice 2

Title of the Practice: Facilitating Students Through Blended Learning

2. Objectives of the Practice:

- To encourage and facilitate the students for self-study, promote participation and boost their confidence.
- To boost digital intelligence of students as well as faculties and to encourage them to acquire digital knowledge
- To blend traditional face to face classes and ICT based online resources

3.The Context:

During the period of Lockdown and in the post-COVID situation, our College adopted both online and blended mode of learning. The College has developed an Online Teaching and Learning Strategy framework as well as a self-learning model for providing an active and personalized education for all the students to complete the University curriculum planned for this academic session. Considering it as a best practice, it is under continuation this year also.

4.The Practice:

To achieve the goals set up, the Blended Teaching and Learning Strategy framework was developed which involved: Various methods were adopted for teaching different theory-based courses as well as lab-based courses by the faculty members of all the departments in the College.

- Program and course-wise what's app groups have been created for doubt clearance session and for sharing notes and study materials.
- PPTS are prepared based on the texts and lectures shared to facilitate critical explanations.
- Subject introduced and study materials were shared to students. They were encouraged to have the self-study.
- After that some doubt-clearing classes were held as per the needs of the students.
- Internal evaluations were conducted by the concerned teachers. Assignments were given both as objective and essay-type questions. Students had to upload pdf files of their handwritten answers after the completion of the examination.

5.Evidence of Success:

Blending of both online& offline teaching and learning enabled much flexibility in issues of time and place for both teachers as well as students. They got the opportunity to explore new and innovative online resources. Online classroom platforms were found to be effective in giving assignments and sharing study materials. For the laboratory courses, students got to learn about some of the advanced instruments. Students tried to be self-learners. The audio-visual as well as library materials helped them a lot.

As the teachers became the facilitators and the method was learners-centered, both the teachers and students learnt the use of modern technology to access the online resources. After receiving feedbacks from both teachers and students and assessing the students performances in the evaluations, it was understood that blended mode of teaching learning would be successful in the long run.

6. Problems encountered and resource required:

As the blended learning expects students to do much of self-learning, the students being habituated to traditional method of feeding by the teachers didn't get complete benefit out of it. Not all the students have the necessary knowledge and skills to use the online resources. The teachers also need proper orientation to help the students. There must be a support mechanism for digital literacy for students and facilitators. Training should be provided to teachers as well as students to make the best use of various online platforms and ICT tools used for Blended Learning.

The library has been enhanced with textbooks, reference books, e-learning resources, and competitive books. Sports facilities have been expanded with purchase new equipments. Additional toilets have been constructed to improve campus infrastructure. Language and IT skills programs have been introduced as value-added courses to boost employability. College is actively pursuing industry collaborations for funding research and development. Faculty members are encouraged to pursue PhDs and engage in research and study leave.
