ABOUT THE COLLEGE

- 3) The abstract must be within 150 300 words and include 4-6 keywords along with 2-4 JEL classification code.
- 4) Both the abstract and full paper must be typed in MS Word, using Times New Roman, font size 12, with 1.5 line spacing.
- 5) Both the abstract and full paper should include the title, author(s), name(s), designation(s), affiliation(s), and Email ID.
